

Local swimmers set masters records

Hope Vowell and Ida Hlavacek each set three state records Oct. 8, at the Arkansas Masters Swim Club short course swim meet at the Little Rock Westside YMCA, and Salley Moore, Zora Caple and Laverne Anderson each set one record.

Vowell, competing in the women 35-39 age bracket, broke records in the 100-yard free style, the 100-yard backstroke and the 200-freestyle, and won the 50-freestyle, the 50-backstroke, 50-butterfly and 100 individual medley.

Hlavacek, competing in the women 40-44 bracket, broke records in the 50-freestyle, 100-breaststroke and the 200-individual medley, while winning the 50-freestyle, 50-breaststroke, 50-butterfly and the 100-individual medley.

Moore set a record in the 200-breaststroke, won the 50-backstroke and finished second in the 50-freestyle, 500-freestyle, 50-breaststroke and 100-breaststroke.

Caple, competing in the women 50-54 bracket set a record in the 100-breaststroke and won second in the 50-backstroke and the 50-freestyle.

Anderson set her record for the 60-64 age category in the 50-freestyle, and won the 50-backstroke, 50-breaststroke, 100-breaststroke and 200-breaststroke.

Richard Tigenelaar, competing among men in the 35-39, finished second in the 50-freestyle, the 500-freestyle and 50-backstroke, and finished third in the 50 breaststroke.

A total of 13 women and 21 men competed in the event, with 17 records set.
